Biosecurity Recommendations:

Traffic into and out of farms still poses a great risk for transmission of the PED virus. If you are not already following these practices, try to incorporate them into your farm activities.

Transport

Do not allow an unwashed trailer to back up to the loading chute at your farm.

Require a washed and disinfected trailer and/or use a shuttle vehicle to allow for truck-to-truck transfer of pigs off farm

Do not allow truck driver to enter barn

Ensure no pigs return to barn after entering trailer Wash and disinfect loading dock after loading pigs When moving your pigs to assembly yards, local abattoirs and/or processing facilities, use designated boots for transport and ensure trailers are washed and disinfected prior to returning to farm.

Feed delivery

Do not allow the feed truck driver access to the barn.

If possible, ensure all feed deliveries are full loads, eliminating the need for a truck to do two unit deliveries with a single load.
